Jobs for Veterans State Grants

About the Program

The Jobs for Veterans State Grants (JVSG) program provides individualized career and training-related services to veterans and eligible persons with significant barriers to employment.

From July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019 there were 2,320 participants in Ohio.


One-Year Outcomes

One year after their last JVSG service, 51% of people were employed in Ohio, and 54% were employed with the same employer at six months and at one year after completion. Of those who were employed, median annual earnings were \$31,500. Workers were most commonly employed in the Administrative/Support/Waste Management/Remediation Services, Health Care and Social Assistance, and Manufacturing industries.


During their exit period and in the following year, 8% of people who completed JVSG services in 2018/19 were enrolled in a public Ohio college.

Employment Over Time

The charts below display employment patterns across a 3 year time period. For those whose JVSG services ended in 2017/18 or 2018/19, employment in Ohio reached 59% 3 months after services and declined steadily to a low of 41% 30 months after services. Median annual earnings rose from \$27,900 3 months after services to \$37,400 36 months after services. Drops in employment beginning at the 12 month and 24 month points coincide with the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic for people whose services ended in 2018/19 and 2017/18, respectively.



In the three years after leaving JVSG, 41% to 59% of people were employed (Statewide, Overall).



In the three years after leaving JVSG, employed individuals earned \$27,900 to \$37,400 per year (Statewide, Overall).
