Vocational Rehabilitation - Adult

About the Program

Vocational Rehabilitation services assist people with physical, mental and emotional disabilities with finding and retaining meaningful work and personal independence.

From July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019 there were 12,394 participants in Ohio.


One-Year Outcomes

One year after completing Adult Vocational Rehabilitation services, 51% of people were employed in Ohio, and 61% were employed with the same employer at six months and at one year after completing Adult Vocational Rehabilitation services. Of those who were employed, median annual earnings were \$12,000. Workers were most commonly employed in the Accommodation and Food Services, Health Care and Social Assistance, and Retail Trade industries.


During their exit period and in the following year, 2% of people who completed Vocational Rehabilitation Adult services in 2018/19 were enrolled in a public Ohio college.

Employment Over Time

The charts below display employment patterns across a 3 year time period. For those who completed Adult Vocational Rehabilitation services in 2017/18 or 2018/19, employment in Ohio reached 59% 3 months after completion and declined to a low of 41% 33 months after completion. Median annual earnings rose from \$11,500 3 months after completion to \$14,400 27 months after completion. Drops in employment beginning at the 12 month and 24 month points coincide with the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic for 2018/19 and 2017/18 Adult Vocational Rehabilitation completers, respectively.



In the three years after leaving VR Adult, 41% to 59% of people were employed (Statewide, Overall).



In the three years after leaving VR Adult, employed individuals earned \$11,500 to \$14,400 per year (Statewide, Overall).
